PREFACE

BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCH

William C. Storrick was born in Straban Township, Adams County, Pennsylvania on September 16, 1856, the son of Adam and Eve Margaret (Seltzer) Storrick. As a six year old child, he was witness to the Battle as his family lived off the Hanover Road not far from East Cavalry Field. Four months later, he was one of those fortunate enough to be present at Lincoln's Gettysburg Address. In 1879 he was married to Mary Jane Brinkerhoff with whom he had several children. After farming for a brief time, Storrick began a teaching career in the public schools of Straban Township which lasted for 34 years. He served with the Gettysburg National Military Park Commission from May 10, 1909 to October 1, 1930, first as caretaker of East Cavalry Field and then as manager of government owned farms. In 1917 he was appointed as Superintendent of Battlefield Guides. He was a member of the Adams County Historical Society and St. James Lutheran Church where for many years he was the superintendent of its Sunday school. He wrote numerous articles on the battle and local history that were published in the *Gettysburg Times*. And he was the author of *Gettysburg: The Place. The Battles. The Outcome* (J. Horace McFarland Company, Harrisburg: 1932). In 1945 he was given an honorary degree of doctor of

letters by Gettysburg College. Storrick died on January 4, 1951 at the age of 94, and is buried in Gettysburg's Evergreen Cemetery.

SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE

The collection is composed of one series: Subject Files of Storrick's research organized alphabetically. Much of the research was done by Storrick for his book about Gettysburg published in 1932.
