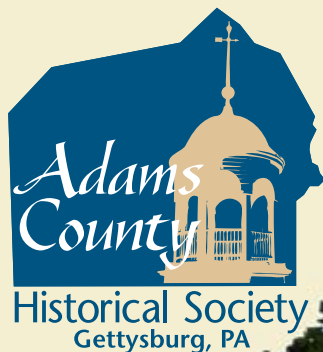

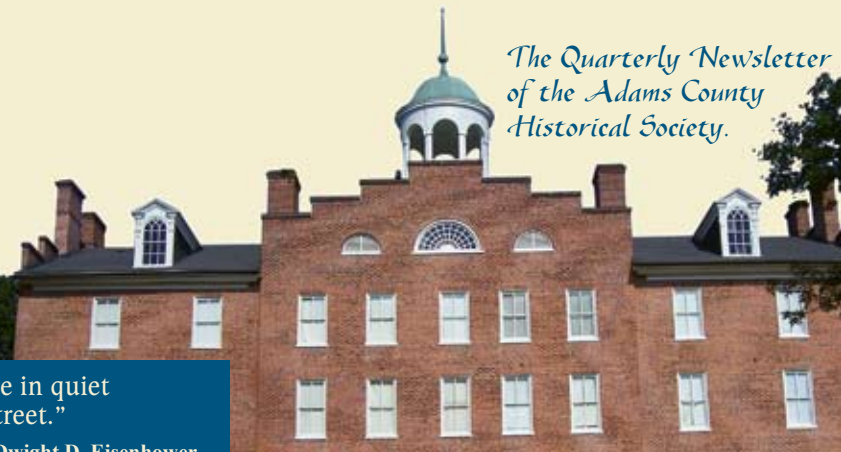

## February meeting in memory of J. Bruce Maclay

On Tuesday, February 5 at 7:30 PM, the speaker will be Society Executive Director Wayne Motts on "Henry Stewart's Battlefield & Gettysburg Photography." Born in 1868, Stewart was the son of Sallie Myers and Henry F. Stewart. He attended Gettysburg College and later became a doctor. As an amateur photographer he recorded hundreds of images of the town and battlefield.

The February meeting is traditionally presented in memory of J. Bruce Maclay (1913-1981), whose son, John B. Maclay, made a generous contribution to the Society in his father's name. J. Bruce Maclay had a twenty-year career with the Gettysburg National Bank and was active in the community and as a Society director from 1971 until his death.

## Eisenhower to be March meeting topic

The "Eisenhower National Historic Site: Eisenhower's Gettysburg Legacy" will be the topic of Carol Hegeman's March 4 presentation. General Dwight D. Eisenhower and his wife, Mamie, donated their Gettysburg farm to the National Park Service in 1967 to become the Eisenhower National Historic Site. Ms. Hegeman is the Supervisory Historian at the Eisenhower National Historic Site and will speak about the history of the historic site, some of the unusual artifacts in its collection, recent research projects and preservation efforts. Ms. Hegeman has conducted over 200 hours of oral history interviews with the Eisenhower family, friends and associates about the Eisenhowers' life in Gettysburg.

## Society Opens The Battle of Gettysburg Research Center

The Battle of Gettysburg Research Center, headquartered in the Adams County Historical Society is now open. The mission of the center is *“to compile, synthesize, digitize and make publicly available research materials related to the Battle of Gettysburg and the Gettysburg campaign including the fields of battle inside Adams County, Pennsylvania as well as act as a portal to identify primary source material related to the same.”*

The Center is open without an appointment during the Society's regular business hours. All members at the \$35.00 level or higher will have access to the Center as part of their membership. The general public will be asked for a \$5.00 donation per day to conduct research, the same as is currently requested to research at ACHS. The Center contains a wide variety of primary source documentation related to the Battle of Gettysburg. Holdings include but are not limited to, bound research sets on loan from the Association of Licensed Battlefield Guides (ALBG); digitized keyword searchable battlefield guide files down to the regimental level also courtesy of the ALBG; digitized civilian accounts, hi-resolution photographs, courtesy of the Center for Civil War Photography, manuscripts, images, books, articles and many other resources.

As part of the Center's mission it will also accumulate finding aides and other bibliographic sources from other institutions with Gettysburg related holdings, thereby acting as a gateway to primary documentation related to the battle held around the work. A keystone of the Center will be its digitized files which have been converted to PDF files and made keyword searchable. A researcher may now search across hundreds of files for one term or research subject. This will make the center a unique place for researching the battle and we hope a must stop for any Gettysburg enthusiast.

## From the Director of Historic Collections...

This past year we have had nearly 100 individuals donate materials to the ACHS. Some of these donations that were accessioned contained well over 100 items. We have increased the number of records put in PastPerfect, our museum database, by 2,367. There are now over 33,700 items in the collection which can be found by a keyword search. Almost every day items in our collections are re-housed in acid-free materials and stored on archival shelving. The more of this material we attend to, the better we are able to preserve them for future generations as well as making the collections available to patrons today. We also created new storage areas as well as more area for research.

A lot of work goes on behind-the-scenes at ACHS. I am very happy with the progress made this year. The bar has been set high for 2008. A lot of people are responsible for making such strides. We have a wonderful group of volunteers that work to preserve the collections and to help researchers use the collections. This organization is also fortunate to enjoy support from the membership that allows us to purchase the materials and equipment needed to fulfill our mission.

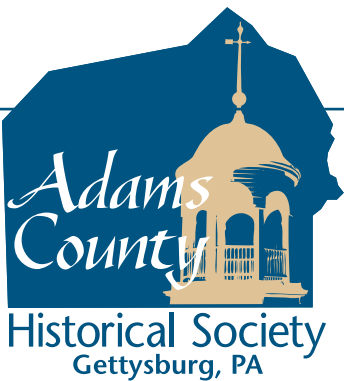
